Victory in Victoria Falls!



Dear Friends,

In this newsletter, I would like to share with you from our last crusade held in Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe. The crusade was very well prepared by our team, working together with the local churches. We were here last year, but we returned because we sensed that we had "unfinished business" to attend to – we needed to make one more push for the Gospel.

One of the first things that happened upon my arrival was that we met two Pentecostal ladies who were senior nurses in the local hospital. Last year during our crusade the Lord healed most of the patients in the hospital and the hospital was nearly empty when the crusade ended. These nurses said, "Pastor, ever since last year's crusade, after all the miracles that the Lord did, we have noticed a great change in the general health of the population. We have had very few patients in our hospital since that time, and medical professionals in town attribute it to the work of God in our town!"

This, my friends, is the power of the glorious Gospel of Jesus the Son of God! Wherever His Word is preached, it changes lives, heals the sick, and transforms communities!

It reminds me of a powerful miracle-packed crusade that we held in Blantyre, Malawi many years ago. God unleashed such Holy Ghost power that for a week after the crusade ended, people came from far and wide bringing the crippled, the blind, and the diseased. As soon as their feet touched the ground the lame walked, the blind saw, and the diseased were healed!

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the most powerful force in the universe. It is so powerful that it can even permeate the soil of the place where it is preached. O the Glorious power in that old Story of the Son of God who died for us upon the Cross and then rose again from the dead! It should be shouted out over all the earth! Hallelujah!

Along with me at this crusade in Victoria Falls

were Swedish evangelist Stefan Edefors and 25 of the main leaders of AWAKE Churches, the denomination that has come under our ministry.

Stefan Edefors is a businessman who also preaches. He has a wonderful ministry and it was a joy to have him with us. The Lord led me to ask him to preach in two of the services, and also to help teach the Pastors. God really used him wonderfully! It is wonderful to share the platform with a brother who has the same Spirit and Holy Ghost Fire!

The field was packed out the first night of the crusade. The Word of the Lord went forth and a large multitude received the Lord Jesus. Then the miracles began to flow. The first thing we saw was a woman who was both deaf and lame get up on her feet and begin to walk, waving and thanking God as the crowd cheered her on. Many people then came up and testified of the wonderful things that the Lord had done for them.

Go ye into all the world and preach

That first night set the tone for the rest of the crusade. Every night, huge crowds came out to hear the Gospel. They listened intently and respectfully. Deep conviction came over people's hearts and they turned to receive the Savior who is always ready to redeem sinners who turn to Him to receive forgiveness and eternal life.

The second night, we saw a man paralyzed in a wheelchair for 7 years suddenly get up and begin to walk. After he had walked a few steps he stopped, turned, and looked back at his wheelchair. He told us later, "At first, I thought that I had died and gone to Heaven. Then I turned and looked back at my empty wheelchair; I realized that I was alive and that God had healed me!"

He then began to run and shout and dance! The crowd came totally unglued shouting, dancing, and praising God!

It carried on like this every single night. Throughout the week, we saw crippled people

getting up and walking, blind eyes and deaf ears opened, and tumors disappearing.

One man testified that he had very large tumors and fibroids all over his body that disappeared. A man who had become paralyzed, unable to walk and totally deaf in one ear after a stroke began to walk and dance after Jesus healed him from everything. A lady whose left arm had been paralyzed ever since she had been struck by lightning showed how the Lord had given her back full use of that arm. In addition to all this, we saw many demon-possessed people delivered by the Power of the Name of Jesus!


The crowd shouted, rejoiced, and danced at each testimony. Pentecostal meetings should be noisy and loud with much praising, shouting, singing, and dancing with our Lord Jesus preeminent in all things. That is the way it is and always has been at our Crusades. We are thankful to the Lord for this Grace that He has bestowed upon us. Surely our Lord Jesus is the Same today as in the days of the Bible!

On the last night, the field was packed with a huge multitude of


people. I preached from 1 John 3:8 about our Lord Jesus' death upon the Cross and His total victory over the devil! As I preached, demons began to manifest. Demon-possessed people began to scream and run around like madmen all over the field. One of them even climbed up to the platform like a monkey, screaming that the demons were trying to kill him. My team took hold of them and cast the devils out of them.

When I finished preaching and gave the altar call, a huge multitude responded and received the Lord Jesus. Then it was time for the Baptism with the Holy Ghost and with Fire. The Holy Ghost fell upon the crowd with violent power. People were falling to the ground, many were shouting, many weeping. The praises of God in other tongues rose to the heavens like a mighty roar from the crowd. The Fire of God came in waves; it was as if the whole field was ablaze with the Glory of God.

During this time, there were troublemakers' at the rear of the crowd who were knocked down to the ground and demons began to come out of them screaming. After that, many people were healed. Deaf ears opened, tumors

disappeared, paralysis, eyes, arms, legs, backs, etc, healed by God's power.

The crusade ended with tens of thousands of people singing, dancing and praising God with all their might. It was revival!

We give all Glory, Honor, and Praise to our Lord Jesus for all that He has done. He alone is Worthy!

We also had daily meetings with the Regional Leaders of our AWAKE Churches. We ministered on the following subjects: The Grace of God, The Face of Jesus and the Glory of the New Covenant, and God gives seed to the sower. The pastors were inspired, fired-up, and excited. Immediately the week after, revival broke out in a number of our main churches and I have received great reports from them since then.

I also met with our team on the Farm and Orphanage Project in Zimbabwe. We have a huge task ahead of us, but the Lord is with us!

Do continue to uphold us in prayer as we continue to preach the Gospel of our wonderful Lord Jesus. I also ask you to pray for our youngest son Gabriel; this was his last crusade with me and he has now started as

a Freshman at the Tepper School of Business at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh. I am going to miss him a lot!





Farm Update September 2009

THE SITUATION IN ZIMBABWE

There is a very dire food shortage in Zimbabwe. The nation's currency was made defunct, after inflation reached 230 million percent. The US Dollar is now the de facto currency and everything is in US Dollars. This has pushed up prices of food and services to levels that are higher than in the US. At the same time, government employees, for example, make only \$100 a month. School fees at run-down public schools are \$60 per child per month.

Because of the high rate of HIV infection, there are many orphans who have lost their parents due to AIDS. These orphans have nobody to care for them.

OUR VISION

We want to get our farm operational, grow food, and build a proper orphanage where we can care for 50 children (to start with). The plan is to have the children live in "family units" of 6 children each in individual homes headed by a couple who shall be their "parents". This way we shall be able to give these unfortunate children "homes", and the love, care, and nurturing that is essential to the growth and development of every child. The income from the farm shall pay for the children's upkeep.

In addition to this, we shall start other projects that would provide jobs for the local people (The unemployment rate is at 90% today). For example, we want to start a bakery which shall sell bread made from our own wheat. This bread shall be available to the local people at very affordable prices. We shall also start a school to teach farming skills and the repair and maintenance of farming equipment to local farmers.

FARM

We have 1000 acres. 650 acres are arable or tillable right now. The rest has small trees and brush that need to be cleared first.

Location: Our farm is right outside the town of Kadoma in Zimbabwe, which is in the middle of Zimbabwe's "Farming Belt". We are the very first

farm outside the city. The city center is about 3 miles away. The grain and produce collection center where farmers bring their crops, grain, and produce is right there, as is the main railway line and the main highway that connects the North and the South of Zimbabwe. All this is within 3 miles from our farm. We are in a prime location so the transport and sale of our harvest is not a problem.

Expertise: We have a local farm team running this project. The two main people in this team have University Degrees in Agriculture and have extensive farming experience. We also have an advisory Board of people with farming experience in PA who are "walking" us through the different steps that we are taking in this project. One of them visited the farm in Zimbabwe a few weeks ago.

Immediate Plan: Our first phase is to bring 250 acres under cultivation. We shall use rented equipment for this. The cost of rented tractor/plow/drivers, diesel fuel, fertilizer, seed etc to do 250 Acres is \$ 55,000. We shall do some corn and mostly soyabeans this year (because soyabeans need less water – we don't have enough irrigation there as yet). We shall also grow some vegetables. We shall double the acreage next year and bring 500 acres under cultivation. There are no rivers close by, so irrigation water is pumped up from the ground by boreholes/wells; this is normal in Zimbabwe. We have 1 borehole/well right now, and we need 9 more which cost \$10,000 each totalling \$90,000. This includes drilling down to 40 meters (about 135 ft – even

though the water table is very high), 6" pipes and casings, electric pumps, irrigation pipes etc. The water output from the borehole we have right now is 2 liters per second (about half a gallon per second), which is good and normal. This translates to 1800 Gallons per hour

Next Phase: Is to purchase our own farm equipment: tractors, plows, discs, planters, combines, etc. We have 2 used tractors right now. We need 5 tractors of 100 HP each with plows/discs and planters. We also need 2 combines. This equipment is available in South Africa at a reasonable cost. As a charity, we can import this equipment Duty and Customs Free into Zimbabwe.

ORPHANS

We are taking care of 12 Orphans right now. We had 14 in all, but 2 of them have died of AIDS. They all live at the farm where they are cared for. We are looking forward to the farm to be developed and to the new Orphanage facilities that we shall build for 50 Orphans (to start with) once the farm is up and running.

The Government of Zimbabwe is favorable to with our project and has offered us THREE more farms of between 800 to 1200 Acres each for similar projects, but we have held off on these and want to get this project done first before we take on any more.
